



## 13 JOB INTERVIEW QUESTIONS – PROBLEM SOLVING

1. Describe a situation in which you analysed complex data and solved a difficult technical problem.
2. Describe a technical or personal problem you solved in your last job.
3. What do you do when confronted with a complex problem? What are the most important steps you take? Why?
4. What problems do you foresee in your current position in the next two years?
5. Describe a time when your work required you to quickly learn a new system, task, or process. What did you do?
6. How would your manager describe your ability to grasp new concepts or learn new tasks?
7. What do you do when you have to learn a lot of new things in your job?
8. What would your peers and managers say about how perceptive you are?
9. Sooner or later everybody makes mistakes. What was the most significant mistake you made on your last job and explain why you made it? What do you learn from it?
10. What have been major obstacles that you have had to overcome on a past project? How did you deal with them?
11. Tell me about a time when you had a sense about something that wasn't obvious to others at the time, yet ultimately was confirmed to be true.



12. Give me an example of one of the most challenging problems you have ever had to solve on the job?

13. Tell me about a problem that you failed to solve? What was it and why couldn't you solve it?
